Thank you for contacting the Office of the Mayor. If you get severe headaches from wearing a mask, it would appear as though you qualify for an exemption from wearing a mask. The below groups of people qualify for the exemption: • Children under the age of two. These very young children must not wear a face covering because of the risk of suffocation. • Individuals with a medical condition that makes it difficult to wear a mask. This can include but is not limited to: · Medical condition, mental health condition, cognitive condition or disability that prevents wearing a mask or face covering. · Medical condition that makes it difficult to breath or someone who is unconscious or incapacitated. • People who are hearing impaired, or are communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, and where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication. • Individuals who are unable to put on or remove a mask without assistance. • Employees and businesses not open to the public. • People who require accommodation in accordance with the Ontario Human Rights Code. · Employees within an area designated for them and not for public access, or within or behind a physical barrier. Furthermore, businesses are not permitted to ask for proof of your medical condition. I hope this information is helpful and once again thank you for reaching out to the Office of the Mayor.
